



Charters vs. Schedules Routes

Driving a scheduled route to transport students to and from school has its own challenges, however deciding to opt to take on additional work transporting students to and from school related activities or taking on private charters adds new challenges.

Many of the challenges stem from familiarization issues such as not being familiar with the vehicle being used, the area the drive is traveling through, the destination, and the passengers. Remember the same challenges with familiarization extend to the passengers you are transporting. They may not be familiar wit the same items as you, the driver.

Preparedness and communication will be key in having a successful, safe, and fun experience.

See below for a quick visualizations of challenges you may experience in driving scheduled routes and driving charters.

| SCHEDULED ROUTES | CHARTERS |

| Same route every day | Different destination each trip |
| Same vehicle each trip | Possibly a different vehicle each trip |
| Area is familiar | Constantly reading signs, looking for landmarks |
| Stops and parking are predetermined | At times, may have to search for parking |
| Bus behavior/rules discussed with driver & pupils | Not always a clear understanding of rules and consequences. |
| Familiar with railroad crossings | Must be on the lookout for railroad crossings |

Documentation Checklists

• Driver Documentation:

- Valid Driver License (suitable to vehicle operated)
- Valid Medical Examiner's Certificate (DOT Medical Card, if suitable to vehicle operated)
- Valid School Bus Certificate (If suitable to vehicle/trip operated)

• Vehicle Documentation:

- Valid Registration(s)
- Valid Insurance Card(s)
- Valid Stickers (Inspections, Registrations, IFTA)
- Vehicle Condition Reports (Current and Previous)
- Approved Director of Safety Exceptions (If required)

• Charter Documentation:

- Destination Information
- Contact Information
- Route Instructions (Include alternate options/have even with use of approved navigation system)
- Fee Details / Resources (Parking, Tolls, Admissions, Fueling, etc)

• Hazard and Emergency Documentation:

- Emergency Contacts (Company On-Call, District/School, Dispatch, Towing, Emergency Services)
- Emergency and First Aid Policies and Procedures
- Reporting Forms (Accident, Evacuations, Hazard Reports etc)

Please check directly with your employer regarding the documentation your should have with your in the event of an accident or emergency as well as a copy of all pertinent charter and emergency polices.
